Sustainability definitions

Remanufacturing is not refurbishing. We turn redundant furniture into innovative new products from waste materials!


Refurbished furniture might have new upholstery or components but refurbishing does not improve the functionality of the product.

Post pandemic agile and hybrid working has resulted in many organisations requiring less numbers of traditional desking and more collaborative spaces. To facilitate hot desking our customers need lockers and secondary storage away from the desk. We are working with our customers to transform their workspaces.

Unwanted desks and tables contain valuable timber that we can cut down, re-edge band and use as new smaller desktops, modesty panels, storage and planters. We also refurbish high quality office seating using new component parts.

Reuse

The action of using a product again, whether for its original purpose, conventional reuse or to fulfil a different function creative reuse or repurposing.

Refurbish

An aesthetic improvement of a worn product, component or material, which might involve making it look like new, with limited functionality improvements.


Remanufacture

The process of returning a used product to at least its original performance with a warranty to match. Remanufacturing is an industrial process by which a previously sold, worn, or non-functional product can be rebuilt. Through the disassembly, cleaning, repair and replacement of worn out and obsolete components, the piece can be returned to a 'like-new' or 'better-than-new' condition and will be just as reliable as the original product.

Recycling

Action of processing a used product, component or material for use in a future product, component or material. Recycling involves actions which change the physical and or chemical state of an item. It includes the processing of organic material (e.g. composting cellulose materials) but excludes items used for energy recovery, as fuels, or for back filling purposes (i.e. where waste is suitable to be applied in a process of landscape engineering).

Our team of experts are available to visit your premises to inspect legacy furniture, create an asset register and confirm which products can potentially be reused, remanufactured or recycled.

Transportation / Relocation

We can arrange the dismantle and transportation of used products to our production facility or to your new location depending on the requirement. Our qualified and experienced installation teams are fully trained in the latest health and safety guidelines and hold valid CSCS cards. Our teams wear fully branded PPE, are DBS checked and carry identification. We have our own fleet of delivery vehicles ensuring we schedule our deliveries as efficiently as possible. Site Supervisors are also SMSTS / SSSTS qualified.

Remanufactured Products

We have developed a range of established remanufactured products which are designed, manufactured and installed by our own team in Wales. We also have the capabilities to create bespoke, innovative new products to fulfil requirements. We work with our customers to ensure we reuse the maximum volume of legacy materials possible whilst protecting the quality and aesthetics of their project.

Training & Employment

Ministry of Furniture is a limited business with community and social aims at its heart. Backed by our strong heritage, we are committed to giving back to our local community, and to the creation of employment opportunities for disabled and disadvantaged people. Currently 30% of our workforce have recognised disabilities or are disadvantaged. We pride ourselves on being a Disability Confident Employer, member of Social Firms Wales and Kickstart Employer. Our manufacturing and remanufacturing facility provides employment and training opportunities for local people.



Waste Reduction and Carbon Footprint

We provide our customers with full details of the materials that have been diverted from landfill following their project. Remanufacturing reduces emissions and waste, so is recognised with BREEAM, LEED and SKA credits.

We have full chain of custody for all new materials used on our remanufactured products.



Supporting the Community

Furniture that cannot be remanufactured is often donated to local schools, charities, clubs and community groups. We work with several local organisations to ensure they have the opportunity to benefit from unwanted furniture where possible.

Our Partners



We are working collaboratively with **Merthyr Tydfil Institute for the Blind (MTIB)** to combine our key competencies for the benefit of our customers and our stakeholders. This partnership allows purchasers the opportunity to benefit from simplified procurement, working with Welsh Manufacturers with social aims and with demonstrable expertise in remanufacturing and the circular economy.

Paint 360 re-engineer waste paint back into brand new paint which has been tried, tested and developed in conjunction with the trade. Each litre contains a minimum 65% recycled content, while competing on quality and price with premium brands. Paint 360 collect waste paint from waste management companies, councils and contractors, increasing recycling rates and delivering a true closed loop service to our clients.

Greenstream Flooring CIC

is a social enterprise with a mission to maximise community benefit from the reuse and sales of flooring in the UK. Established in 2008 in response to the number of carpet tiles being wasted and sent to landfill, we recognise the life left in carpet tiles as well as the carbon saved. Carpet tiles are a complex material made with nylon and designed to last for 20 years or more. Reuse was recognised as an opportunity for this material, enabling a more sustainable option when people and organisations were looking for flooring.



Swansea Council


We have been working with Swansea Council since 2018 to update the Civic Centre workspaces.

The brief for this project was to reuse or remanufacture as much furniture as possible.



The offices were refurbished with G64R remanufactured chairs, re-engineered desking and lockable storage made from old desks.

The staff dining area contained dining tables and poseur tables remanufactured from scaffolding planks and poles. Privacy pods and soft seating chairs and sofas introduced a space for relaxing during breaks.

The formal meeting rooms feature Moka Felt meeting chairs which are made from recycled PET plastic bottles.


Desking, lockers and planters were made from legacy furniture stock within WLGA and WCVA's current assets with new soft seating and collaborative furniture areas complimenting the overall design.

New furniture ranges were specified from Nomique who support MTIB as their primary supplier of soft seating frames. Responsible procurement and supporting the circular economy were highly important to all organisations involved in this project.


Carpet was supplied by Green Stream Flooring who are also a business with social aims.

With an aesthetic driven by functionality, Smart Ocean has a timeless beauty that's universally relevant in any workspace.





Hemp Fine chair is part of the worlds' first collection of chairs created with a uniquely produced shell from biomaterial. Using a locally-sourced hemp and Plantics bio-resin, Nomique were able to produce Hemp High and Hemp Fine.
